TOPIC: State Project: Recognizing and Reporting Sex Trafficking in the Medical Practice

There are more than 300,000 victims of human trafficking in Texas, including almost 79,000 minors and youth victims of sex trafficking and nearly 234,000 adult victims of labor trafficking. It will include a description of the health issues related to this form of severe abuse and the indicators seen in victims and their traffickers. Participants will know how to respond to victims in healthcare settings and report the abuse in all areas of Texas.
